# **Block Party Fundraiser Supports Food Pantries for Low-Income Seniors**

Nevada HAND's annual Block Party fundraiser is on October 3 at Symphony Park at The Smith Center. All proceeds will support essential on-site food pantries for low-income seniors who live in Nevada HAND communities. Members of the media are invited to join us for the event.

LAS VEGAS, NV, September 27, 2024 – Nevada HAND, the state's largest provider of affordable housing, is hosting its second annual fundraising event, the Block Party, on October 3, 2024, at Symphony Park at The Smith Center. Nevada HAND is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that raises money throughout the year to benefit its nationally certified Resident Services program. The 2024 Block Party proceeds will support an essential aspect of that program: on-site food pantries for low-income senior residents who live in Nevada HAND communities.

### **About the Nevada HAND Block Party**

The Block Party is a true "party with a purpose," a fun, informal celebration and an important fundraiser for Nevada HAND's mission of providing affordable housing and supportive Resident Services for low-income families and seniors. At our inaugural event in 2023, we raised enough funds to purchase a brand-new accessible vehicle for our transportation services fleet! The 2024 Block Party will feature delicious food and drinks, music and lawn games, and an opportunity to donate to help us "Pack the Pantry" with healthy supplemental food for low-income seniors.

### **About Nevada HAND's Senior Choice Food Pantries**

Nevada HAND serves over 8,200 low-income residents, approximately 3,000 of whom are seniors on fixed incomes. Many low-income seniors, even those living in stable affordable housing with Nevada



HAND, struggle to afford all their monthly necessities, such as utilities, healthcare, transportation, and groceries. No one should have to choose between paying bills and having regular, nutritious meals, so Nevada HAND's Resident Services team has designed integrated on-site food pantries offering healthy supplemental food free of charge to all residents at our senior communities.

The pantry program was established in 2019, thanks to a generous foundational anonymous gift, and has proven an invaluable resource utilized by several hundred residents every month. Picture a mini grocery store on-site in a senior apartment community, where friendly staff members help residents choose from healthy foods like fresh milk, eggs, and produce; frozen proteins like fish and chicken; essential paper goods; and pantry staples like pasta, bread, cereal, and canned veggies and proteins. A monthly visit to the pantry for healthy supplemental food and essential supplies can save a low-income resident (with an average monthly income of about \$1,750) approximately \$120, or about the cost of 30 meals.
